From The President's Sights — By Ed Dresner

Hi, and how is everybody. Thanks to all that came to this past meeting. We had approximately 75 people at the meeting, of which a half dozen or so were prospective new members. We accomplished a milestone in the Club's history. We set the schedule for the entire year (with the exception of a definitive date for our Cache le Pew Rendezvous, which will probably be in September). We set dates for sporting clays, cowboy action shoots, pistol Bulls Eye shoots, orientations, and introductory to black powder shooting day (this shoot is sponsored by the Rendezvous committee and anyone can come & shoot our muzzle loaders and do not have to have any equipment of their own – we normally see quite a few 4-H, girl scout & boy scout kids). In addition, we set turkey and ham shoot days for the New Mexico Mountainmen.

FOR THE ENTIRE ANNUAL SCHEDULE, SEE THE ATTACHED SHEET; THE SCHEDULE WILL ALSO BE LISTED ON OUR INTERNET SITE: WWW.NMBHGC.ORG. THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL MEMBERS ARE NOT AN "INFORMATION OPERATOR" TO USE AS A RESOURCE TO FIND OUT IF THE RANGE IS OPEN ON ANY PARTICULAR DAY. KEEP AND POST THIS SCHEDULE FOR FUTURE REFERENCE. AS CHANGES ARE MADE THEY WILL BE POSTED ON THE INTERNET SITE AND COME OUT IN THE BI-MONTHLY NEWSLETTER. OCCASIONALLY WE WILL SEND A POST CARD IF THERE IS A SHORT NOTICE CHANGE AND OCCASIONALLY WE WILL JUST SCREW UP AND THE RANGE WILL BE CLOSED FOR AN UNANNOUNCED ACTIVITY – BEAR WITH US, WE ARE DO-ING THE BEST WE CAN. (Remember, the Executive Council work jobs just like you do).

During this meeting we discussed some very serious Range safety issues specifically relating to nonmembers who shoot in the county park or who climb our fence to shoot. Here are the rules to follow if there is some type of incident:

- 1) Do not confront an armed person.
- 2) If a person has climbed the fence, and is cooperative, allow them to shoot as your guest. Explain the Club to them. When you leave the Range, they will have to leave at the same time you do.
- 3) If there is an immediate danger to life & limb, call 911and ask for assistance.
- 4) If there is not an immediate danger to life & limb, as soon as possible after the incident, write a report of the incident, stating dates, times, etc. This can be given to a Club officer who will then present it to the Torrance County Sheriff's Department, or better yet, you turn it in to the Torrance County Sheriff's Office and give a copy to the Executive Council.

There have been numerous complaints about our Club & I believe most of the problems are being caused off our Range by non-Club members. Thus, it is important that we all start documenting all incidents, no matter how slight, to protect the sovernity of the Club.

This is a shooting event in which you will compete with firearms typical of those used in the taming of the Old West: single action revolvers, lever action rifles and side by side double barreled, pre-1899 pump, or lever action shotguns.

Contestants shoot in one to four gun stages; engaging steel and cardboard targets.

Scoring is based on accuracy and speed.

EQUIPMENT

Originals and reproductions of firearms manufactured during the early to late 1800's, including Colts, Winchester, Remington, Smith & Wesson, Marlin, Sharps and Henry are allowed.

RIFLES: Any lever or slide action, tubular fed, exposed hammer rifle or carbine manufactured between 1860 and 1899, or any reproduction thereof.

- Centerfire, .25-20 caliber or larger
- Rifle must be in "pistol" caliber. .32-20, .38 Special .38-40, .44-.40, and .45 Colt. No "rifle calibers such as .30-.30 or .38-.55 are allowed.
- Only 1860-1899 period style original or replica open iron sights or tang mounted peep sights are allowed.
- Barrel must be over 16" in length.
- Rifles with box magazines may not be used.

SHOTGUNS: Any side by side or single shot shotgun typical of the period from 1860-1899 without automatic ejectors is allowed. Lever or slide action single barrel, tubular feed, exposed hammer shotguns of the period are allowed, whether original or replicas. Military configurations are not allowed.

- No larger bore than 10 gauge and no smaller than 20 gauge
- All shotguns must have a barrel over 18" in length
- Number 4 LEAD BIRDSHOT or SMALLER must be used in all events. (No steel or plated shot).
- Magnum and high-velocity loads are not allowed
- Pump and lever action shotguns are allowed to load no more than two rounds at a time.

REVOLVERS: Since this is a "Traditional" Match, you may use any single action cartridge, percussion, or black powder cartridge conversion revolver manufactured prior to 1896, or a reproduction thereof.

- .32 caliber or larger
- Must have non-adjustable, traditional, notch-style sights. Dovetailed front or rear sights are acceptable for percussion and black powder cartridge conversion firearms if they conform to sights commonly found on the originals.

Examples: Colt SAA; Ruger Vaquero; Smith & Wesson American, Russian, or Schofield; Remington Models '75 or '90; Bisley; and their reproductions

*There will be no specific age or gender categories in this particular shoot.

HOLSTERS, CARTRIDGE BELTS AND BANDOLEERS

- All handguns must be carried in a safe holster capable of retaining the firearms throughout a normal range of motion
- Man-match holsters must be located one on each side of the belly button and separated by at least the width of two fists at the belt
- Ammunition required for reloads during the course of any stage must be carried on the shooter's person in a bandoleer, belt, pouch or pocket. Rifle and pistol ammunition may not be carried in a shotgun loop.
- Bandoleers, cartridge belts and pouches must be of traditional design. Leather belt slide ammo loops are acceptable, however, shotgun shell slides may not be worn over shotgun belts.

MAIN MATCH AMMUNITION

- Revolver ammunition must have a muzzle velocity less than 1,000 fps. Rifle ammunition must have a muzzle velocity less than 1,400 fps.
- Revolver and rifle ammunition may not be jacketed, semi-jacketed, plated, gas checked, or copper washed. It must be ALL lead.
- Revolver and rifle ammunition must be of "single-projectile" design. "Multiple-projectile" bullets are illegal.

SCORING-TIMING, RANGE OPERATONS AND SAFETY PRACTICES WILL ALL BE COVERED FOR YOU AT ORIENTATION
